Purpose

Following the reinstatement of the Enrolled Nurse (EN) Scope of Practice in 2011 and development of the Enrolled Nurse Support into Practice Programme (ENSIPP), a consistent approach is needed to support EN's professional and career development across the District. This pathway details the professional development expectations for ENs that will remove inconsistency and ambiguity regarding the role of the EN in clinical areas across the District. This pathway enables ENs to work to the top of their scope, and values ENs through investment in their professional development, therefore, supporting retention within the workforce.

Background

Over the past four years the number of ENs entering the nursing workforce has steadily increased due to the employment of graduate ENs through the Enrolled Nurse Support into Practice Programme (ENSIPP). However, there is a lack of visibility of a career and professional development pathway following their graduate year. The Nursing Council of New Zealand (NCNZ) has gazetted a new EN Scope of Practice which has now come into effect (from 20 January 2025) therefore a professional development pathway is needed in order to support ENs to work to the new scope of practice.

The EN professional development pathway aims to:

- Promote the professional development and career progression of ENs within all services across Capital, Coast and Hutt Valley District
- Align the progression with PDRP requirements, and identify pathways that will support consistent practice in all practice areas across the District
- Align the professional development of ENs with the new scope of practice and NCNZ standards of competence
- Clarify expectations and access to professional development by providing a consistent pathway of professional development
- Support policy development within Capital, Coast and Hutt Valley to include ENs

Process and Outcomes

The pathway will reflect policy updates to ensure that these outcomes are consistently reflected in clinical practice.

Professional development framework can start immediately and align with current PDRP levels. Education will be required to ensure that line managers and Nurse Educators can support process change and communicate this with clinical teams. Regular review of the framework will be required to ensure that the EN workforce is supported to work at the top of their scope and considers funding requirements and availability of external professional development opportunities.
